Biography

Shiga Lieko (b. 1980 in Aichi) is a photographer based in Miyagi. She graduated from the Chelsea College of Arts and Design, London Institute in 2004. In 2007, her photobooks Lilly and CANARY won her the 33rd Kimura Ihei Award. Her major solo exhibitions include Rasen Kaigan, Blind Date, and Human Spring.

Abe Jun (b. 1955 in Osaka) graduated from the Osaka School of Photography (now: Visual Arts Osaka). Between 1982 and 1994, he travelled extensively, mainly through Asia and Europe, as the official photographer of butoh dance group Byakko-sha. Since 1983, he has been part of various photography-related projects, among them Shashin-Juku, Little Gallery, Vacuum Press, and Vacuum Gallery. In 1995, he began teaching at Visual Arts Osaka. His numerous photobook publications include Citizens, the Kokubyaku Note series.

Iwane Ai is a photographer based in Tokyo, where she was born, and in Miharu in Fukushima. After finishing high-school in Petrolia, California, in 1996, she began her career as a photographer. With her 2018 photobook KIPUKA, Iwane Ai won the 44th Kimura Ihei Award. Her work is currently exhibited as part of the Aomori Gokan Art Fest 2024.

Karibe Taro (b. 1988 in Aichi) uses media technology and perceptual systems to reinterpret complex facets of today's reality. His photobook publications include Saori and Aim an Arrow at the Rock in the Ocean.

Nagase Sayo (b. in Hyogo) is a Tokyo-based photographer. She has published more than twelve books to date, both through Paris- and Stockholm-based publisher Libraryman as well as her own label Yomogi Books. Her recent exhibitions include Milky Way, Merry Go Round, Clarity, I and II. Her most recent publication is the photobook Clarity.

Yoshino Erika graduated from the Tokyo College of Photography in 1994. In 2018, she won the Higashikawa New Photographer Award and the Sagamihara Prize for Newcomer Professionals. Her major exhibitions include Neroli and Collection: Serendipity Wondrous Discoveries in Daily Life. She has published the photobooks Windows of the World, Jobim, and many more.
