Fugensha has held 160 exhibitions through November 2024. Although we did not initially plan to specialize in photography, it has been a decade that has inevitably led us to "photography." Aya Fujioka's "where the flowers go" exhibition held in May 2021 was an exhibition in which she collected photographs of flowers that she had unconsciously taken over the past 30 years of her career and reexamined her own transition through photography. Following this approach, we would like to exhibit a part of our collection that we have gradually collected over the past 10 years, and use this exhibition as an opportunity to look back on the trajectory of the past 10 years.

•VIVO

Fugensha's memorable first "photography" exhibition was Eikoh Hosoe's "Ordeal by Roses" in March 2015. The fortuitous opportunity to exhibit his works in the gallery's early days led to many encounters at Fugensha and led us into the profound world of photographic expression. We are pleased to present works by Daido Moriyama and Hitoshi Fugo, who were Hosoe's disciples, and Kikuji Kawada, a member of the legendary photo agency "VIVO" as well as Hosoe.

TOKYO

Up to now, Fugensha has been following the work of photographers who document cities in the present. We will continue to respectfully and carefully look at the work of such photographers in order to keep a macroscopic view of the times and, above all, to constantly examine the feet on which we ourselves currently stand. You will see works related to Tokyo by Mitsugu Onishi, Shintaro Sato, and other artists introduced in our magazine of "Sha Shin".

Portrait

Hiromi Tsuchida's "Aging 1986-2018," held in February 2020 as a post-relocation exhibition in Meguro, Ryuichi Ishikawa, who sees "Zekkei (spectacular scenery)" in portraits, Keiko Nomura, who photographs women's bodies in Okinawa, where Eros and Thanatos are strongly illuminated, Kazutomo Tashiro, who records the human condition spilling over from the term "people of the disaster area," and Ryu Ika and Wang Lu, who photograph their relatives. From "A Blight Room" by Shingo Kanagawa, who explores a new image of "family" through photography and text, please enjoy the work of photographers who are not afraid to encounter others and change themselves through the camera, and who are open to such possibilities.
